International Student Scholarship Conditions

A complete International Student Application for Undergraduate Admissions, including all required credentials, must be on file in order to be considered for a scholarship. Please contact The College of St. Scholastica International Undergraduate Admissions officer regarding special scholarship deadlines that may apply.

1. Criteria considered when choosing recipients include:

- a. The student's ability to contribute culturally to the diversity at St. Scholastica.
- b. The financial need of the student.
- c. The fit of the student's goals with the mission of the College.
- d. The student must be enrolled full-time (15-18 credits).
- e. The student must live on campus.
- f. The student must have a United States or international financial sponsor that agrees to cover all expenses in excess of financial aid from the school. (Sponsors must document sources of money and the willingness to fully support the student.) Any student unable to provide the needed resources to attend The College of St. Scholastica will be in violation of his/her visa requirements and INS will be notified.

2. These grants will be renewable on an annual basis for up to three additional years provided the student follows the following guidelines:

- a. Makes satisfactory academic progress (GPA at least 3.0 for 90% scholarship or greater, GPA at least 2.75 for 60% to 90% scholarship, and GPA at least 2.5 for scholarship below 60%).
 - b. Participates in at least two student activities per year (a student activity may be any college club or organization, including intercollegiate sports, service organizations, departmental/major clubs, residence hall organizations, student government, etc.).
 - c. Maintains his/her portion of financial support.
 - d. Maintains full-time enrollment (15-18 credits).
 - e. Continues to live on campus in either the residence hall or apartments (required for students receiving greater than 50% scholarship).
 - f. Requests a renewal in writing each year. The written request should be addressed to the Student Financial Planning Office and must be received by March 1 for the following academic year. The conditions stated above will be applicable each year the scholarship is received.
