

Veritas General Education Transfer Guide For students transferring from Argosy University 2018-2019

This guide is provided for students who are transferring credits to fulfill general education categories for the College of St. Scholastica's General Education program referred to as Veritas. The Veritas general education requirements include a mix of Conceptions courses (typically lower division 1000-2000 level) and Integrations courses (upper division 3000-4000 level courses intended to be writing intensive).

Students must complete two Integrations courses at The College of St. Scholastica and the remaining Veritas General Education requirements can be met with approved transfer courses. The table below shows the Argosy University courses that meet each of the Veritas requirements.

Grades earned must be a C or better for transfer. To transfer credits an official transcript must be sent directly to the College.

Dignitas* (Required for students entering as first-year students.)	Extended studies, online and transfer students are exempt from this requirement.
World Language* (Required for students entering as first-year students.)	Extended studies, online and transfer students are exempt from this requirement. Students admitted as first-year students can meet this requirement in any of the following ways: <i>1. By having completed 3 years of one language in high school</i> <i>2. By showing proficiency through a placement exam</i> <i>3. By English not being your first language.</i> <i>4. By successfully completing a second semester language course</i>

*All students entering as “first-year students” are required to complete the world language requirement and the first-year experience known as Dignitas. Extended studies, online and transfer students are exempt from the World Language and Dignitas requirements.
