

The College of St. Scholastica accepts credits in transfer to satisfy general education requirements as noted in this guide. Grades earned must be a C or better for transfer. To transfer credits an official transcript must be sent directly to the College.

This guide is provided for students who have not completed the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum MnTC and would like to complete the lower division general education requirements at the community college. The College of St. Scholastica accepts the (MnTC) to fulfill the CSS general education requirements except for the Dignitas, religious studies and upper division integrations requirements. The lower division religious studies requirement can be fulfilled by an approved transfer course (see below).
