About the Elementary Education Degree Completion Program

The Elementary Education Degree Completion Program is intended for individuals who have an associate's degree and would like to complete their bachelor's degree. The program allows students to earn their B.S. in Elementary Education and the Minnesota K-6 teaching license in just two years.

Individuals who do not possess an associate's degree are encouraged to apply for the program, but pre-requisite requirements and degree completion times may vary.

Requirements for Admission to the Elementary Education Major

- Recommended 60-69 transfer credits
- 2.8 cumulative GPA
- Minimum of a "C" grade in all prerequisite courses (see transfer table on reverse side of this guide).
- Application to Elementary Education major and acceptance into the program. Includes successful background check (\$50.00).

Note: Meeting minimum entrance requirements does not guarantee admission.

Program Start Dates

The program begins each fall. The following application deadlines apply; early submission is encouraged.

- Application Deadline: July 15

Transferring to The College of St. Scholastica from Century College

The College of St. Scholastica accepts credits in transfer to satisfy major requirements as noted in this guide. Grades earned must be a C or better for transfer. To transfer credits an official transcript must be sent directly to St. Scholastica.

St. Scholastica Graduation Requirements

- Minimum 128 semester credits earned
- Minimum 42 upper division credits (at or above the 3000 level)
- Last 32 credits taken at CSS, 16 credits in the major
- Complete the requirements for general education and your major
- Meet all GPA requirements for the major (overall 2.8)
- Maximum number of PED credits that can count toward graduation is 8
