

Campus Accessibility

ON-CAMPUS ACADEMIC BUILDINGS

The College of St. Scholastica Duluth campus includes the following academic buildings: Tower Hall, Mitchell Auditorium, Little Theatre, Burns Wellness Center, and the Science Center.

All academic buildings on campus, with exception of the Burns Wellness Center and fifth floor of Tower Hall, are interconnected in a unique design (tunnel system) that allows for easy passage from area to area.

Each building provides ADA compliant elevators and bathrooms.

OFF-CAMPUS ACADEMIC BUILDINGS

The College of St. Scholastica has several off campus locations where classes are offered: Austin (Riverland Community College), Brainerd (Central Lakes College), Cloquet (Fond du Lac Tribal and Community College), Duluth (Blue Stone), Grand Rapids (Itasca Community College), Inver Grove Heights (Inver Hills Community College), Rochester, St. Cloud, and St. Paul. Most locations are housed at community colleges, with the exception of Blue Stone, Rochester, St. Cloud, and St. Paul. Blue Stone, Rochester, St. Cloud, and St. Paul campuses buildings provide ADA compliant elevators and bathrooms. Each community college is required to have ADA compliant elevators and bathrooms. DULUTH CAMPUS HOUSING

Accessible apartments/rooms are available in each of the residential areas on campus. Somers Hall is the primary dorm facility that houses Freshman/Sophomore students. This building provides ADA compliant elevators and bathrooms.

Many apartments on campus, with the exception of Birch and Pine, provide ADA compliant elevators and bathrooms. Birch and Pine do provide a ramp to the second floor.

PARKING

All campus locations provide accessible parking for academic buildings and housing units. Ramp parking is available at the St. Paul campus.
