


Finding the Permalink in Ebsco Databases

Let the Library help you add content to your courses without the worry of copyright! One way to do this is to add links to your courses, it is strongly recommended that you add the permalink to your courses. This will ensure that you are adding content to your courses that is free of copyright issues.

To locate the permalink in Ebsco databases, follow these steps:

1. Once you find the article you want, click on the title of the article, which will open up the record of the article.
