

MINNESOTA STATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES* ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN	St. Cloud Technical and Community College AND The College of St. Scholastica
<small>*The Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities is authorized by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 136F to enter into Agreements and has delegated this authority to colleges and universities.</small>	

This Agreement is entered into between **St. Cloud Technical and Community College** (hereinafter sending institution), and **The College of St. Scholastica** (hereinafter receiving institution). This Agreement and any amendments and supplements, shall be interpreted pursuant to the laws of the State of Minnesota.

The sending institution has established a **Business Management A.S. degree** (hereinafter sending program), and the receiving institution has established a **Business Management B.A. degree** (hereinafter receiving program), and will facilitate credit transfer and provide a smooth transition from one related program to another. It is mutually agreed:

Admission and Graduation Requirements

- A. The receiving institution's admission and program admission requirements apply to both direct entry students and to students who transfer under this agreement.
- B. Students must fulfill the graduation requirements at both institutions.
- C. Students must complete the entire sending program and meet the receiving institution's admission requirements for the agreement to apply, including grade requirements for courses and an overall GPA requirement.

Transfer of Credits

- A. The receiving institution will accept 60 credits from the sending program. A total 68 credits remain to complete the receiving program.
- B. Courses will transfer as described in the attached Program Articulation Table. For system institutions, once the courses are encoded, they will transfer as described in the "Transferology" audit.

Implementation and Review

- A. The Chief Academic Officers or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of this agreement, including identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, assuring compliance with system policy, procedure and guidelines, and conducting a periodic review of this agreement.
- B. This Articulation Agreement is effective on 06/01/2018 and shall remain in effect until the end date of 06/01/2023 or for five years, whichever occurs first, unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice.
- C. The college and university shall work with students to resolve the transfer of courses should changes to either program occur while the agreement is in effect.
- D. This Articulation Agreement will be reviewed by both parties beginning 12/01/2022 (within six months of the end date).
- E. When a student notifies the receiving institution of their intent to follow this agreement, the receiving institution will encode course waivers and substitutions.

Special Notes, if any:

Students should select MnTC courses as noted above to meet general education categories for the College of St. Scholastica's General Education program referred to as Veritas. The Veritas requirements for transfer students are noted below.

Foundations courses: First Year Composition, Interpersonal Communication, Math
Pathways areas (Conceptions or Integrations level courses): Natural Science, History, Social Sciences, Literature, Fine Arts, Philosophy, Religious Studies (conceptions level course), and Open Pathway

The Veritas general education requirements include a mix of Conceptions courses (typically lower division 1000-2000 level) and Integrations courses (upper division 3000-4000 level). Integrations courses must be completed at the College of St. Scholastica and are intended to be writing intensive. Students may transfer in much of the coursework for Veritas, however, they must complete two Integrations courses (8 credits) at the College of St. Scholastica. The Business Management BA curriculum includes two Integrations courses – MGT 3354 fulfills the Philosophy Pathway and Integrations credits and MGT 3150 fulfills the Open Pathway and Integrations credits. Other Veritas General Education requirements can be met by completing courses noted in Section A. General Education transfer equivalency information is available in the course notes area on the Transferology website at www.transferology.com.

While the College of St. Scholastica does not require the completed Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) for admission, St. Scholastica does accept the MnTC to fulfill the Veritas General Education requirements except for a conceptions level religious studies course and one St. Scholastica Integrations course. The religious studies requirement may be fulfilled by PHIL 1360 Comparative World Religions. Integrations may be fulfilled by MGT 3150 and MGT 3354 in the Business Management BA curriculum.

Please note that students admitted as first-year students must also complete the College of St. Scholastica's first-year program referred to as Dignitas.

Grades earned must be a C or better for transfer. For an evaluation of transfer credit an official transcript must be sent directly to The College of St. Scholastica.

SECTION B - Major, Emphasis, Restricted and Unrestricted Electives or Other

(pre-requisite courses, required core courses, required courses in an emphasis, or electives (restricted or general) within the major). Restricted electives (in Major) fulfill a specific requirement within a major. Example A: "Choose two of the following three courses;" Example B: A Biology degree may require 40 science credits (20 credits of required courses + 20 credits of listed related courses, such as botany, genetics, sociobiology, etc. which students can select)




- Minimum 128 semester credits earned
