General Education Requirements

In addition to completing the courses required for the major, students must also complete The College of St. Scholastica's General Education requirements referred to as Veritas. The Veritas requirements for transfer students are noted below.

Foundations courses: First Year Composition, Interpersonal Communication, Math
 Conceptions and Integrations courses: Natural Science, History, Literature, Fine Arts, Religious Studies, Social Sciences (met with ECN courses in the major), Philosophy (met with MGT 3354 in the major), and the Open Pathway (met with MGT 3150 in the major)

Students may transfer in much of the coursework for Veritas, however, they must complete two general education courses at The College of St. Scholastica (CSS) that will fulfill the Integrations requirement. MGT 3150 and MGT 3354 in the major will fulfill the Integrations requirements. These courses are upper division courses that are intended to be writing intensive. Remaining general education requirements can be met with approved transfer courses. General Education transfer information is available in the course notes area on the Transferology website at www.transferology.com.

The College of St. Scholastica also accepts the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) to fulfill the Veritas General Education requirements except for a religious studies course and one Integrations course. The religious studies requirement may be fulfilled by an approved transfer course. MGT 3354 and MGT 3150 will fulfill the Integrations requirement.

This guide applies to the 2020-2021 academic year and is subject to the transfer policy noted in the college catalog in effect at the time of admission to the College. Please note that students admitted as first-year students must also complete the Dignitas requirement.

Transferring to The College of St. Scholastica

The College of St. Scholastica accepts transfer credits to satisfy major requirements as noted in this guide. Grades earned must be a C or better for transfer. To transfer credits an official transcript must be sent directly to St. Scholastica.

Requirements for Admission to the Business Management Program

- High school diploma or GED
- Cumulative GPA of at least 2.0 for entrance into the college

Note: Meeting minimum entrance requirements does not guarantee admission. The College may still consider applicants with a lower GPA through a special status committee; contact an admissions counselor to learn more.

St. Scholastica Graduation Requirements

The following minimum College requirements must be met for the bachelor's degree:

1. Satisfactorily complete a minimum of 128 semester credits including:
 - Forty-two upper-division credits (numbered 3000 or above).
 - A major program as stipulated by a department or advisor.
 - Achieve a minimum GPA of 2.0 in the major as well as an overall "C" average.
2. Fulfill the residence requirement:
 - The last 32 credits before graduation must be earned at The College of St. Scholastica.
 - A minimum of 16 credits must be earned in a major field at The College of St. Scholastica.
 - Cross-registered courses may count toward residence; CLEP and Portfolio Assessment credits must be earned before the final 32 credits. (A variation on cross-registration may be available with other institutions with advisor approval. For example, students on our extended campuses might take consortium work through a partnered community college.)
3. Complete the general education requirements. Requirements for some majors are more stringent than these minimums.
4. The maximum number of physical education credits that can count toward graduation is 8.
